n 1998, when the first CIO of the Year\*
ORBIE\* Award was presented, it was the products, not the people, who were at the center of attention. Laptop of the Year, Printer of the Year and PC Magazine's Editor's Choice awards were common, but it was a start-up called Intellinet that noticed the real heroes were Chief Information Officers (CIOs) who implemented these products, developed solutions and created business value for their organizations.

Roll the clock ahead twenty years, and today CIOs are at the center of business transformation for all organizations. Technology is the engine that drives innovation and growth in every industry and sector in our global economy. It is the leaders and their respective teams, who facilitate change by tech-enabling their organizations who are the rock stars of business today.

The first CIO of the Year Awards was not only a trailblazer for recognizing the people leading transformation, but eventually led to creating GeorgiaCIO - a local, member-centric, profes-

In 2015, we launched BostonCIO and formed the Inspire CIO Leadership Network (Inspire-CIO), a national professional association for CIOs with local chapters in Georgia, Boston, Dallas, Chicago, Alabama, Charlotte, Houston, Minneapolis, Philadelphia, DC and soon to be New York & Bay Area. We are proud to serve CIOs in growing relationships, recognizing professional achievements and inspiring the next generation of technology leaders.

This year, nearly 150 nominations were received for the 2019 Houston CIO ORBIE Awards, which will honor CIOs across six categories for leadership effectiveness and business value created through innovative use of technology. Finalists and winners are selected through a rigorous, independent judging process led by prior ORBIE winners.

The power of CIOs working together & collaborating – across public and private business, government, education, healthcare and nonprofit organizations – is incredible. Together, we are making a difference transforming our organizations with technology and enriching Houston and our world.

The CIOs honored this year are inspiring and challenge all of us to step up and lead well in our organizations. On behalf of HoustonCIO, I congratulate all the finalists on their accomplishments and share our gratitude for the sponsors, underwriters and staff who make the 2019 Houston CIO ORBIE Awards possible.





hange never easy, but James Dallas has spent three decades developing techniques to make it as painless as possible in the business world. Now retired after 22 years with Georgia-Pacific and more recently seven years at Medtronic, the former senior executive and agent of change will be the keynote speaker at the Houston CIO of the Year ORBIE Awards.

Born in Atlanta, Dallas was one of five children. His father died when he was 10 years old, leaving his mother to raise them alone. Dallas learned early on how to adapt to change, attending six different elementary schools and four different high schools across Atlanta.

Growing to a height of 6-feet, 7-inches, Dallas went to the University of South Carolina Aiken on a basketball scholarship. He majored in accounting. "I was going to be in the NBA," he said confidently. "But I was going to keep track of my money." Dallas didn't achieve

basketball stardom. "The NBA didn't pan out," he said. "But being an accountant did." Dallas was employed as a cost accountant at Georgia-Pacific when he saw his first personal computer and realized, "It's going to change everything." recognized Dallas computer's potential to improve communication in the workplace. "At the time, we were having trouble talking to the data processing people," he recalled. What they needed was someone to bridge the gap between the business side and the technology side. Dallas set his sights on becoming that bridge. "Whoever is the bridge, whoever connects the two sides, is invaluable," he explained. Dallas enrolled at Georgia State University, taking night classes in computer science and eventually joined Georgia-Pacific's IT team. His efforts paid off. Dallas spent more than two decades at Georgia-Pacific, eventually serving as senior vice president and CIO. He was about to retire in 2006 when an executive recruiter convinced him to take a senior vice president position in Minnesota with Medtronic. He would go on to spend seven years with the company before officially retiring in 2013.

"James is an exceptional executive with uncanny ability to listen, synthesize and then galvanize the team into the appropriate line of action," said Sandy Cutler, retired chairman and CEO of Eaton Corp. who served with Dallas on the KeyCorp board. "His understanding of the complexities and nuances of change management makes him a go-to executive for any organization taking on largescale change."

Over the course of his career, Dallas successfully implemented more than 10 trans-formational and turnaround initiatives, 30 acquisition integrations and five operations/quality shared services centers of excellence. "I see strategy as a commodity," Dallas said. Despite retiring, his legacy

Despite retiring, his legacy lives on in the talent he worked to cultivate during his tenure. Dallas proudly notes that there are at least eight CIOs of billion-dollar companies who used to work for his organizations. He continues to help develop talent through his consulting business James Dallas & Associates and through his 2015 book "Mastering the Challenges of Leading Change."

Joan Rohs, managing director of World 50 Inc., has worked with Dallas to help technology executives become more effective leaders.

"He is one of the most astute people I've ever had the pleasure to work with, particularly as it comes to leading transformational and influencing, change both in the C-suite and more broadly," she said. "Using his own experiences in these areas, he's a wonderful sounding board and thought partner for these executives. And he does all of this with a sense of humor and humility that is truly remarkable."



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














#### WHAT IS YOUR GREATEST SUCCESS IN YOUR CURRENT ROLE?

Austin Industrial was experiencing a significant decline in market share with top customers not satisfied with productivity/efficiency of our services, manually intensive processes & lagging reporting metrics. IT in partnership with the president and operations group designed & developed a package of custom solutions called AIMS (Austin Intelligence Management System) to improve productivity, providing enhanced safety solution, providing customized virtual training & customer specific dashboards. Customers experienced \$6.5m in savings over last 7 months, win rate increased from 5% to 20% & Austin is quickly regaining its lost market share with technology being a key leading differentiator in the industry.

Don joined Exterran AS VP & CIO in January 2011, after serving in several roles at El Paso Corporation for 10 years. His most recent assignment at El Paso was Vice President of Information Technology Business Solutions, where he was responsible for applications supporting all aspects of the business worldwide.

#### WHAT IS YOUR GREATEST SUCCESS IN YOUR CURRENT ROLE?

In 2015, we split the company into two separate public companies, Archrock and Exterran. This was accomplished in only 7 months and involved duplicating hundreds of systems and separating petabytes of data include duplicating the ERP system. We built an entirely new data center environment for Archrock, separated the networks, and met the goal of each company being able to function day one as its own public company.

#### WHAT IS YOUR GREATEST SUCCESS IN YOUR CURRENT ROLE?

The greatest success is the collaboration my IT team and I have with our Business Technology Team (BTG) and the Office of Innovation to deliver an in-house data reporting/analytics solution to provide leadership with more predictive analytics for decision-making. And at the same time, piloting a game-changer "tenant engagement app" that will put more services at the hands of our tenants; from finding a parking spot, to accessing the building/office, to ordering food, reserving a conference room, and signing up for other amenities -- all from a single app.

#### WHAT IS YOUR GREATEST SUCCESS IN YOUR CURRENT ROLE?

HFF's integration and rollout of Salesforce last year yielded huge benefits for HFF. It enabled advanced CRM and collaboration features without requiring a full rewrite of our custom deal tracking system. It proved to the firm's leadership that premier 3rd party platforms could be integrated with our custom system in a  $\hat{a} \in \omega$ best of both worlds $\hat{a} \in \omega$  approach, paving the way for a Workday project. It proved that our IT could handle a project over 100 staff-months in size. And most importantly, in the initial 12 months it more than paid for the entire IT budget via incremental revenue.


